On April 23, 1970, the Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area Planning Commission approved a Resolution designating the document Toward a More Livable City: As an urban beautification plan element of the Comprehensive Development Plan for the Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area. In accordance with Section 2, Chapter 131, Session Laws of Kansas, 1965, certified copies of the approved Resolution was sent to interested legislative and administrative agencies for their review, comments and recommendations.

After the 60-day waiting period expired, as prescribed by law and there being no comments, recommendations or amendments received, the document Toward a More Livable City was again presented to the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission for final action. Consequently, at their regular meeting on Thursday, July 19, 1970, the Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area Planning Commission formally adopted the Resolution which designates the Toward a More Livable City: As an urban beautification plan element of the Comprehensive Development Plan for the Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area.



The approval action was taken by the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission on April 23, 1970.

The Urban Beautification Plan Element entitled "Toward a More Livable City" is designed to aid local public and private groups in increasing the use and beauty of local open space and other properties. Federal grants are now available to supplement local public expenditures for certain beautification purposes.

In order to qualify for these grants a locality must be active in all phases of comprehensive planning. An urban beautification plan must be made. The agency responsible for planning must have reviewed the beautification program and found the activities consistent with other plan elements. Moreover, the local general purpose units of government and any other public body separate from the general purpose units that apply for beautification grants must officially adopt the plan.


Page 2 - Memorandum - April 29, 1970

The attached certified copy of a Resolution approved by the Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area Planning Commission on April 23, 1970 was a step in the adoption process.





Also, the Planning Commission may consider at the April 23 public hearing their overall recommendation and approval of the *Toward a More Livable City - An Urban Beautification Plan for Wichita, Kansas* proposals or amendments thereto, adopt a resolution approving the same and set a time and place for the formal adoption of the *Toward a More Livable City - An Urban Beautification Plan for Wichita, Kansas*.
