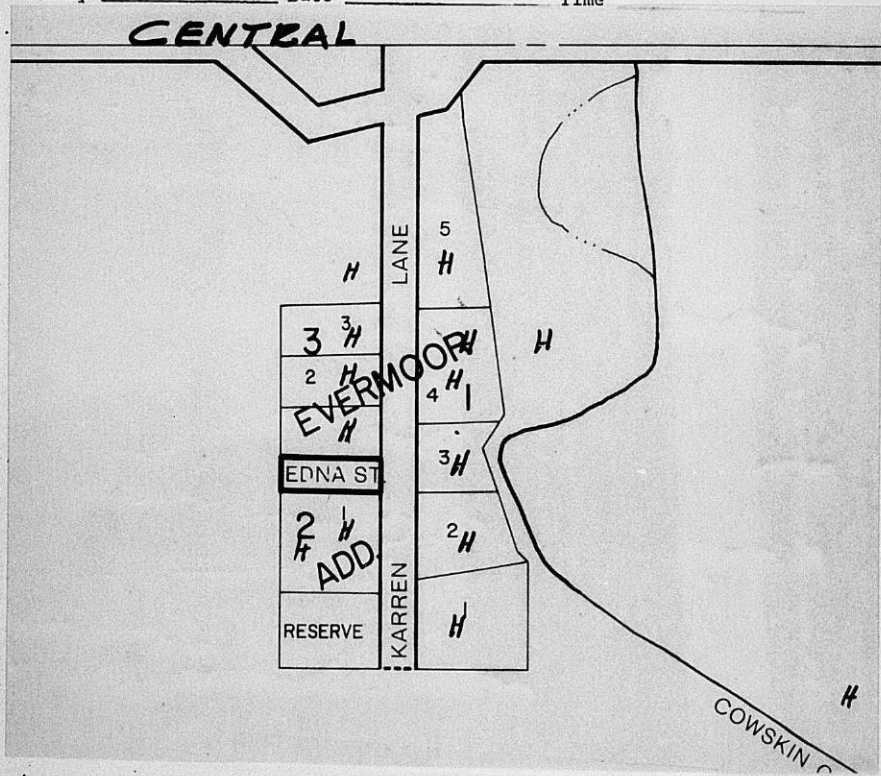

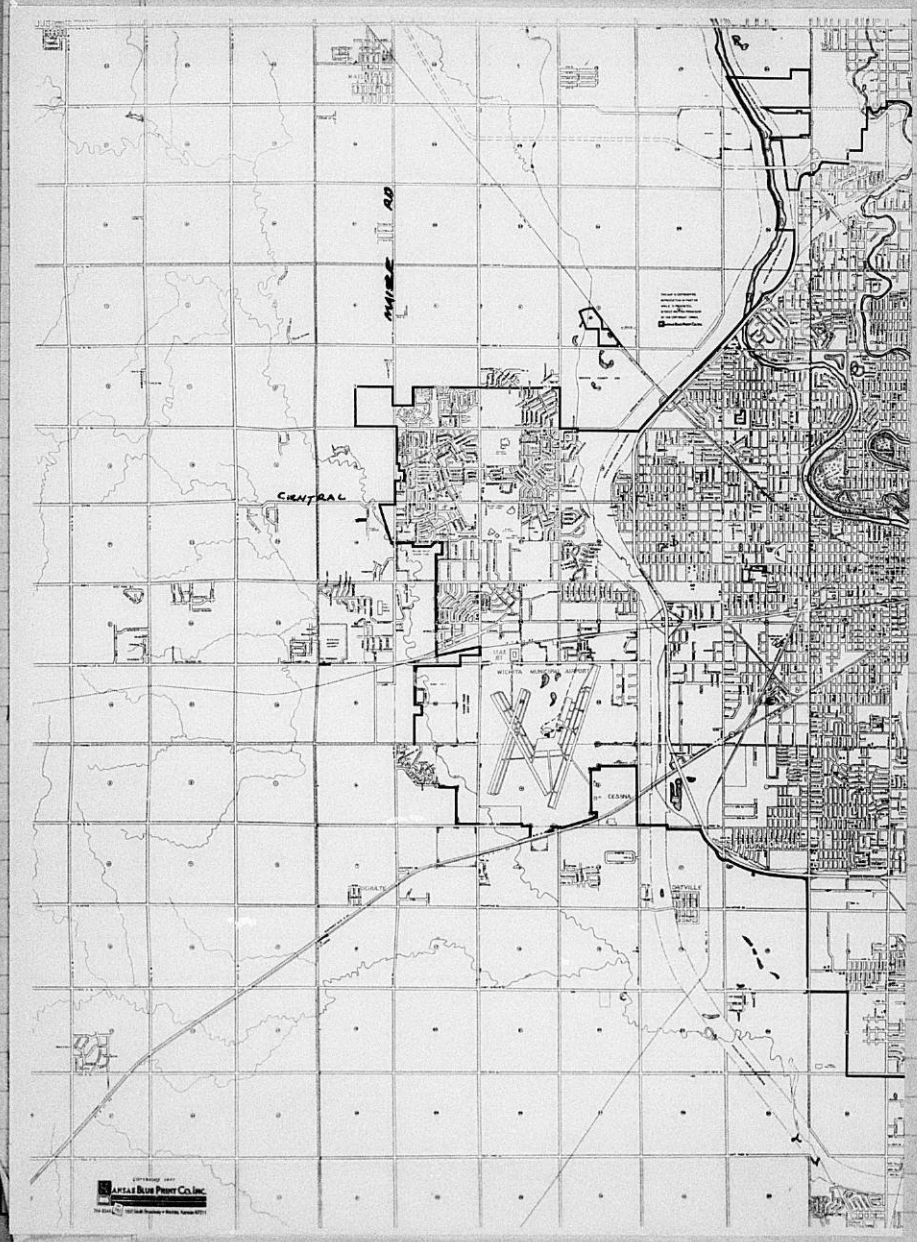

Bill Anderson, Purchasing Officer, appeared before the Board and stated all items he deemed necessary to publish had been properly published, and also stated all items being considered by the Board should be approved subject to the availability of funds except for Item #2 which is the Sheriff's nine road patrol cars which will be purchased from a grant.

Bill Anderson stated he had an off agenda item for Public Works which he would like the Board to hear first thing. Bette McCart so moved; Robert Hornung seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous with Grover McLure abstaining as Director of Public Works.

Bill Anderson stated the off agenda item is for the repair of a caterpillar tractor.

Grover McLure stated the repair of the caterpillar tractor is an emergency since it is necessary for Public Works to get this machine back into the fleet and requested the Board approve this as a sole source item for \$7,212.68 from Foley Tractor Company.

Paul Barron, Public Works, appeared before the Board and stated the caterpillar tractor is in use at all times and the County cannot supply the parts nor labor for this repair.

Upon the statements made, Robert Hornung moved to approve this item as an emergency and accept the bid from Foley Tractor Company for \$7,212.68 as a sole source; Joe Cotton seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous with Grover McLure abstaining as Director of Public Works.

SEDGWICK COUNTY - Trash Service

Bill Anderson read the following bids for the four (4) County locations; i.e., Old Courthouse, New Courthouse, Youth Holding Center, and E.B. Allen Memorial Hospital.

It was noted there is a large difference in the low bid in comparison to the other bids received; therefore, Purchasing was requested to verify the bid of Barnes Trash Company did meet all specifications and report back to the Chairman that before he meets with the County Commission on Wednesday, October 26, 1977.

Grover McLure moved to accept the low bid meeting specifications; Robert Hornung seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

SHERIFF - Nine Road Patrol Cars (Cont.)

Sam Davison, Undersheriff, appeared before the Board and stated the patrol cars will be purchased through a grant from the Kansas Highway Coordinating Office. He recommended the Board approve the purchase from Suburban Ford Inc. for \$48,746.97 since the Sheriff's Department had purchased Plymouths in the past and have had "terrible experiences" in maintaining them.

Paul Barron stated the sixteen 1977 Plymouths the County had purchased in past few months, have required more warranty work than any other cars in the shop. He stated in checking with the Highway Patrol and the Kansas Turnpike, they had expressed the same opinion. He further stated Public Works desires Fords because they have parts in stock and Fords have proven to have less maintenance problems. James Pattinson asked Paul Barron if the specifications for the 1978 automobiles were the same as those for the 1977 Plymouths that were being described as a "terrible experience". Paul Barron responded that the only difference were wiring requirements in the cars roof lining and a different color of paint on the doors.

Upon the statements made, Grover McLure moved to accept the bid of Suburban Ford for \$48,746.97 subject to approval of the Highway Coordinating Office and based on the County's experience in maintaining cars; Bette McCart seconded the motion. The motion carried with Cecil Cope and James Pattinson voting "No".

Twelve vendors contacted; four responses.

Robert Hornung stated he had been asked to relay to the Board by his department that the bids should be forwarded to GCCA and no action will be required by Purchasing or the Board of Bids.

Bill Anderson stated he felt even though these items are being funded by GCCA, the County's charter resolution on purchasing procedures still applies to any and all purchases made by the County; thus, all purchases must go through the Purchasing Department.

After inquiring of Bob Hornung and learning that one week's delay would not be critical to this purchase, Cecil Cope moved to table this item for one week and allow the Legal Department and Purchasing Department to contact GCCA to verify whether the bids had to be forwarded to GCCA unopened; Grover McLure seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous with Robert Hornung abstaining as a representative from the District Attorney's Office.

It was later noted by the Chairman, that GCCA procedures require all bids to be opened by the grantee (the County), which requirements he read into the taped minutes. There was a consensus that the matter should remain tabled for one week since vendors responding to this item had left the meeting when this matter was previously tabled.

EXCERPT FROM THE PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES OF OCTOBER 13, 1977

4. DR 77-24 - Sedgwick County Department of Public Works requests a street name change for Edna Street as platted in Evermoor Addition. Generally located on the west side of Karren Lane, in an area south of Central.

GALBRAITH pointed out that there is an Edna Street already existing in the City of Wichita.

BELL commented that there were 13 families living on the other Edna Street as pointed out in the Subdivision Committee meeting, and that three were addressed on the street in question.

Edna Bourn
WEBSTER BOURN, JR., 10909 W. Edna, was opposed to the street name change and stated that every family living on Edna was against the name change. He said that the other Edna Street cannot be extended, it would run into May Street. There are other streets in Wichita that do not line up either. He asked what would happen if an emergency vehicle is needed, such as a fire truck, ambulance or taxicab and they could not find Binter (proposed street name).

GREIDER assured Mr. Bourn that the Fire Department is the first agency to be notified of street name changes.

BOURN stated that he has worked with the Fire Department and the first thing they do is grab a map and if the new name is not listed, then it is their impression that its a false alarm. They do memorize the streets, but a fill-in officer might miss it.

MAY asked how long has the Edna streets existed.

LAKIN remarked that they both have existed since the mid 50's.

SAVINA suggested that the street name be changed to Edna Lane.

MRS. JOSEPH NEDEAU, 10901 W. Edna, stated that was going to be her suggestion also.

COLE asked what kind of occupation is addressed in this residential area. BOURN stated an excavation business.

MOTION: That the Planning Commission recommend to the County Commission that Edna Street be changed to Edna Lane. Savina moved, Hennessy seconded and it carried by a vote of 8 in favor (Barrier, Bayouth, Taylor, Greider, Hartstein, Hennessy, May and Savina) and 2 opposed (Bell and Cole).


Gentlemen:

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





EXCERPT FROM THE PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES OF OCTOBER 13, 1977

4. DR 77-24 - Sedgwick County Department of Public Works requests a street name change for Edna Street as platted in Evermoor Addition. Generally located on the west side of Karren Lane, in an area south of Central.

GALBRAITH pointed out that there is an Edna Street already existing in the City of Wichita.

BELL commented that there were 13 families living on the other Edna Street as pointed out in the Subdivision Committee meeting, and that three were addressed on the street in question.

WEBSTER BOURN, JR., 10909 W. Edna, was opposed to the street name change and stated that every family living on Edna was against the name change. He said that the other Edna Street cannot be extended, it would run into May Street. There are other streets in Wichita that do not line up either. He asked what would happen if an emergency vehicle is needed, such as a fire truck, ambulance or taxicab and they could not find Binter (proposed street name).

GREIDER assured Mr. Bourn that the Fire Department is the first agency to be notified of street name changes.

BOURN stated that he has worked with the Fire Department and the first thing they do is grab a map and if the new name is not listed, then it is their impression that its a false alarm. They do memorize the streets, but a fill-in officer might miss it.

MAY asked how long has the Edna streets existed.

LAKIN remarked that they both have existed since the mid 50's.

SAVINA suggested that the street name be changed to Edna Lane.

MRS. JOSEPH NEDEAU, 10901 W. Edna, stated that was going to be her suggestion also.

COLE asked what kind of occupation is addressed in this residential area. BOURN stated an excavation business.

MOTION: That the Planning Commission recommend to the County Commission that Edna Street be changed to Edna Lane. Savina moved, Hennessy seconded and it carried by a vote of 8 in favor (Barrier, Bayouth, Taylor, Greider, Hartstein, Hennessy, May and Savina) and 2 opposed (Bell and Cole).

Edna Street within the city limits of Wichita is an east-west street lying east of Sheridan and one block north of May Street in Downtain's Addition. Downtain's Addition was platted in May 1955. There are fourteen (14) residences addressed on this street.

Edna Street in the county lies one block south of Central and west of Karren in Evermoor Addition. Evermoor Addition was platted in July 1956. There are three (3) residences addressed on this street.
