

VACATION HEARING

RECOMMENDATION FROM MAPC TO BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS

V-1348 - VACATION OF A PORTION OF A PLATTED UTILITY EASEMENT
GENERALLY LOCATED NORTH OF 29TH STREET NORTH IN AN AREA EAST OF
OLIVER.

NOTE: The City Clerk will certify as to proper publication of notice of hearing and filing of written protest.

A petition for the above-identified vacation request has been filed in the Office of the City Clerk. The Planning Commission recommends that the Board of City Commissioners find that no private rights will be injured or endangered and the public will suffer no loss or inconvenience by granting by order the vacation request subject to:

- A. Proper publication of notice of public hearing.
- B. The absence of proper written protest filed with the City Clerk.
- C. All proceedings being without cost to the City, County or any utility company.
- D. Any relocation or reconstruction of utilities necessitated by this vacation shall be at the sole expense of the applicant.
- E. The applicant shall submit a signed vacation petition.
- F. The applicant shall grant, by separate instrument, the substitute utility easement required through the center of this lot. Based upon a drawing submitted with the vacation application, it appears that this easement will need to be granted from the north line of 29th Street to the south line of the floodway on the west 20 feet of the east 110 feet of the lot.
- G. The vacation order shall exclude from vacation that portion of the utility easement which lies west of and adjacent to the substitute utility easement required by this case. The legal description for that part of the utility easement to be vacated shall be approved by City Engineering prior to preparing the Vacation order, Petition and Notice.

ACTION: Close the public hearing, approve the vacation request, accept the utility easement, authorize the Mayor to sign the Vacation Order and instruct the City Clerk to file a certified copy of the order and utility easement with the Sedgwick County Register of Deeds.

The utility easement lying within the east 110 feet of Lot 1, East Wind Addition, Wichita, Sedgwick County, Kansas.

VACATION ORDER

NOW on this 29th day of October, 1985, comes on for hearing the petition for vacation filed by Bill G. Yung, praying for the vacation of the following-described utility easement, to-wit:

The utility easement lying within the east 110 feet of Lot 1, East Wind Addition, Wichita, Sedgwick County, Kansas. (MAPC NO. V-1348)

The City Commission, after being duly and fully informed as to fully understand the true nature of this petition and the propriety of granting the same, makes the following findings:

1. That due and legal notice has been given by publication as required by law, by publication in the Daily Record of notice of this vacation proceeding for consecutive weeks on OCT 16 & 23, 1985.
2. No private rights will be injured or endangered by the vacation of the above-described utility easement, and the public will suffer no loss or inconvenience thereby.
3. In justice to the petitioner(s) the prayer of the petition ought to be granted.
4. No written objection to said vacation has been filed with the City Clerk by any owner or adjoining owner who would be a proper party to the petition.
5. The vacation of the utility easement described herein should be approved.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS, on this 29th day of October, 1985, ordered that the above-described utility easement is hereby vacated. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the City Clerk shall certify a copy of this order to the Register of Deeds of Sedgwick County.
