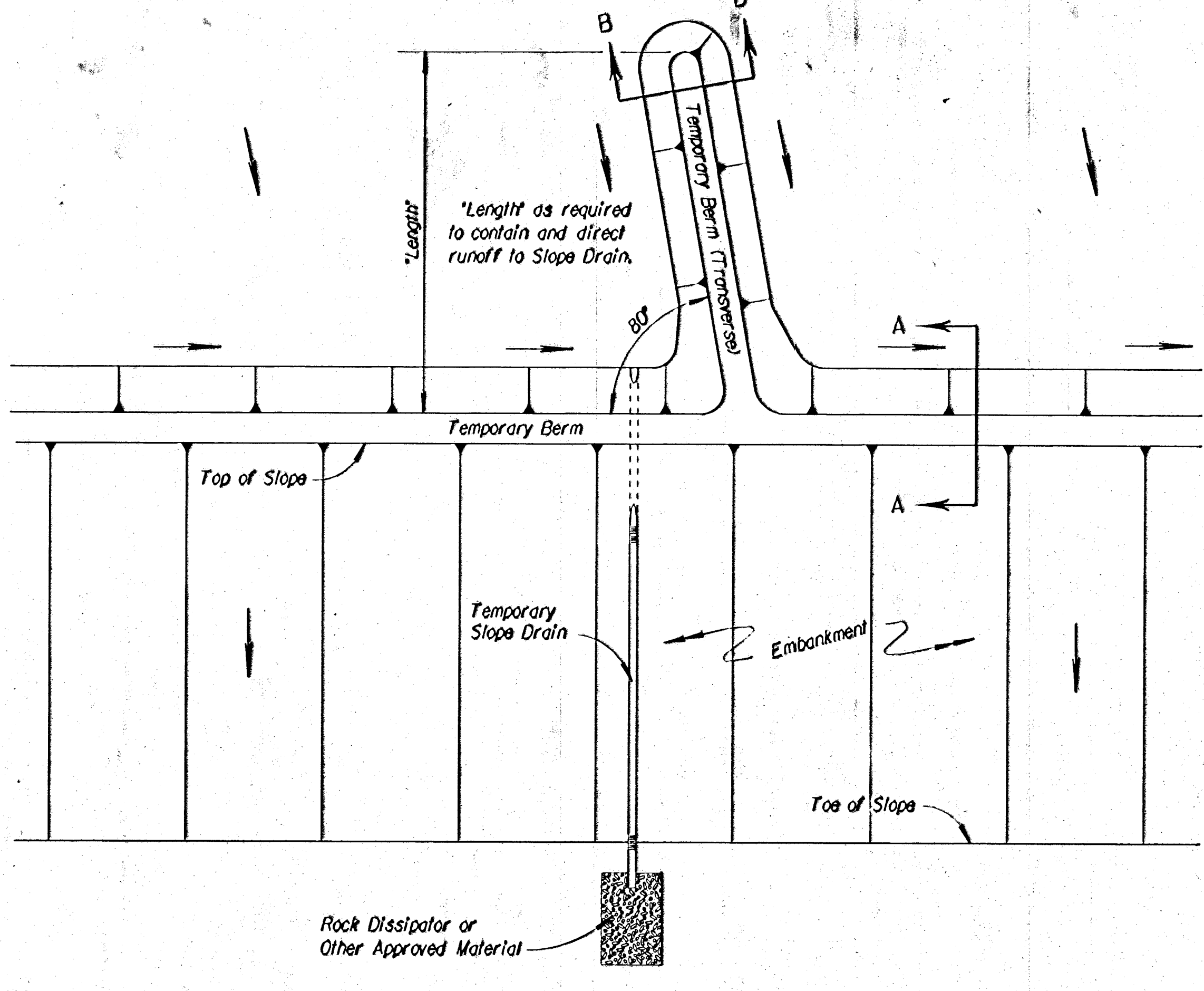
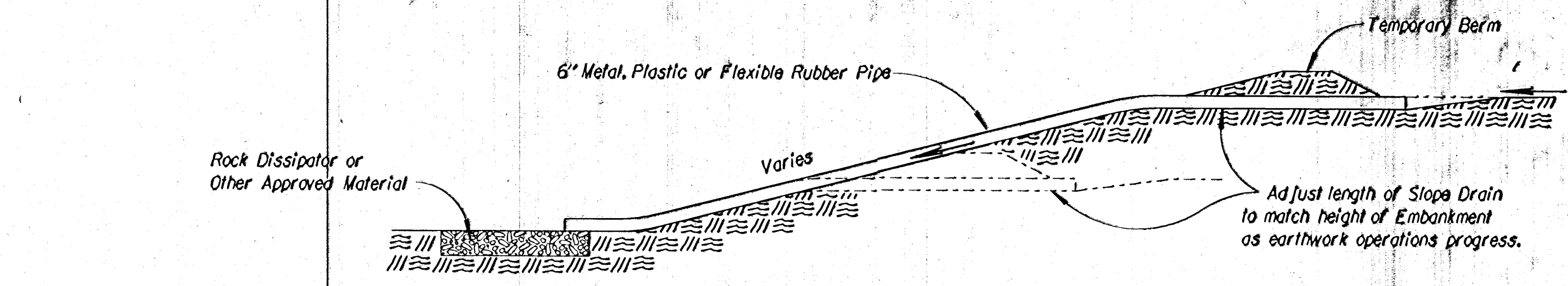


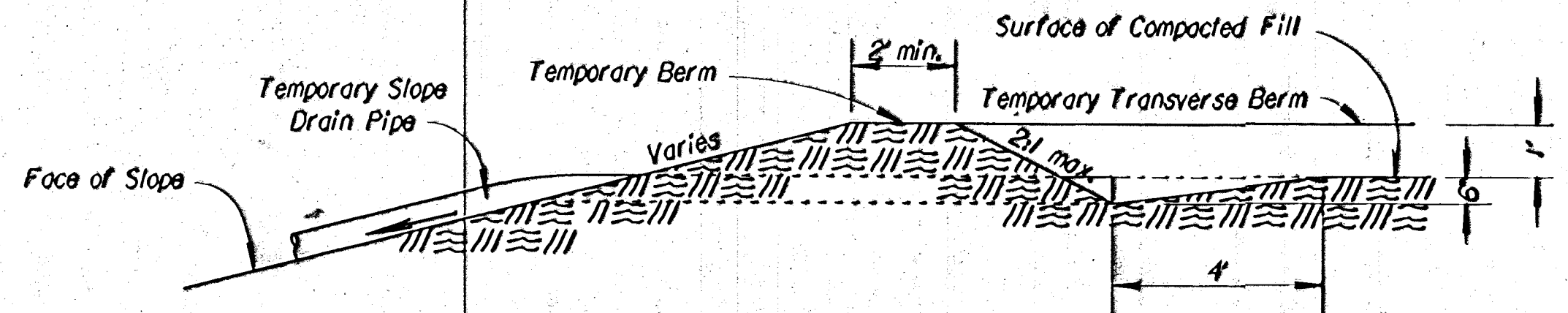
- NOTES:

 - 3) Pipe shall be secured in place as approved by Engineer.



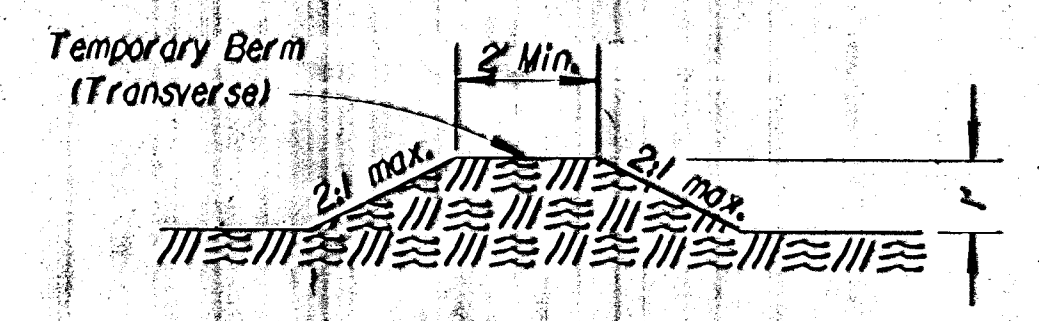
TYPICAL PLAN VIEW OF

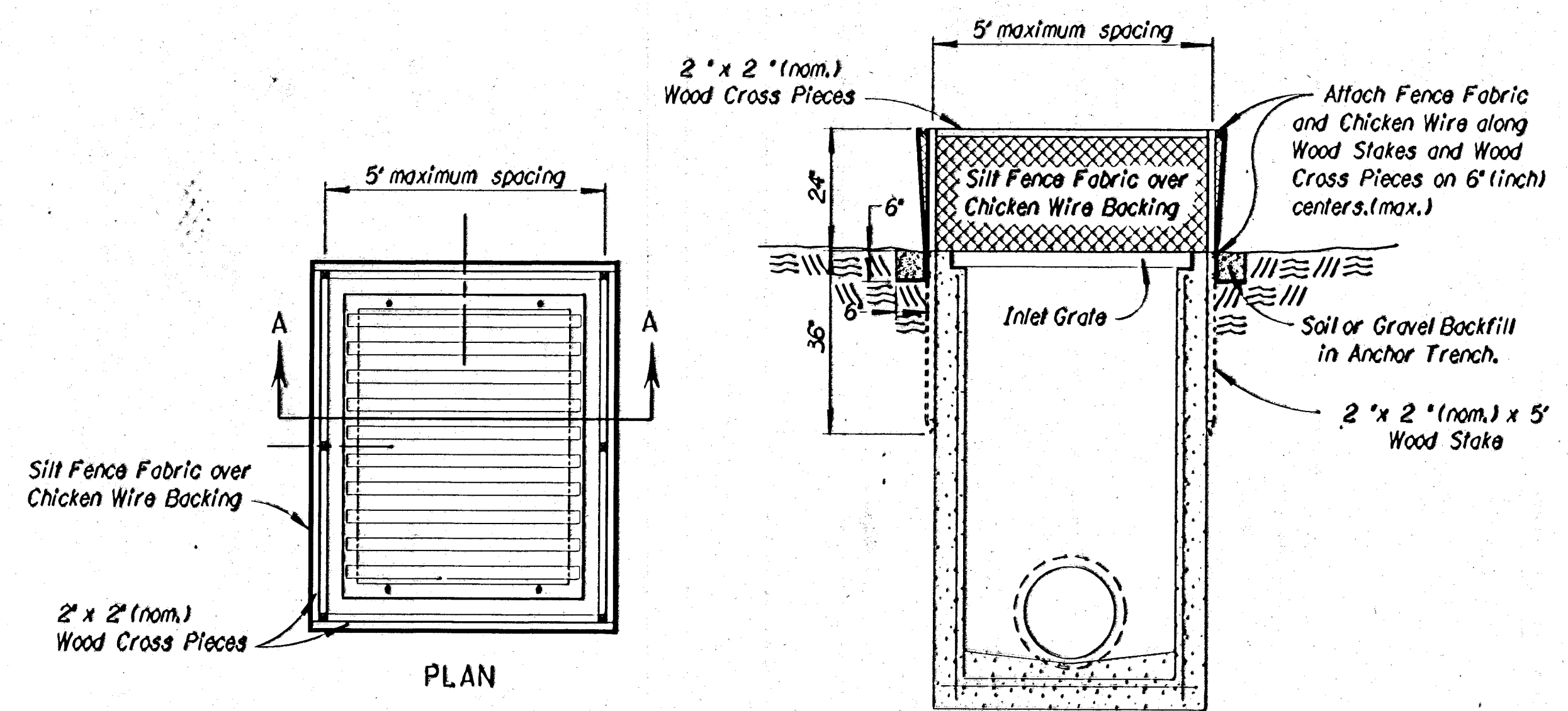

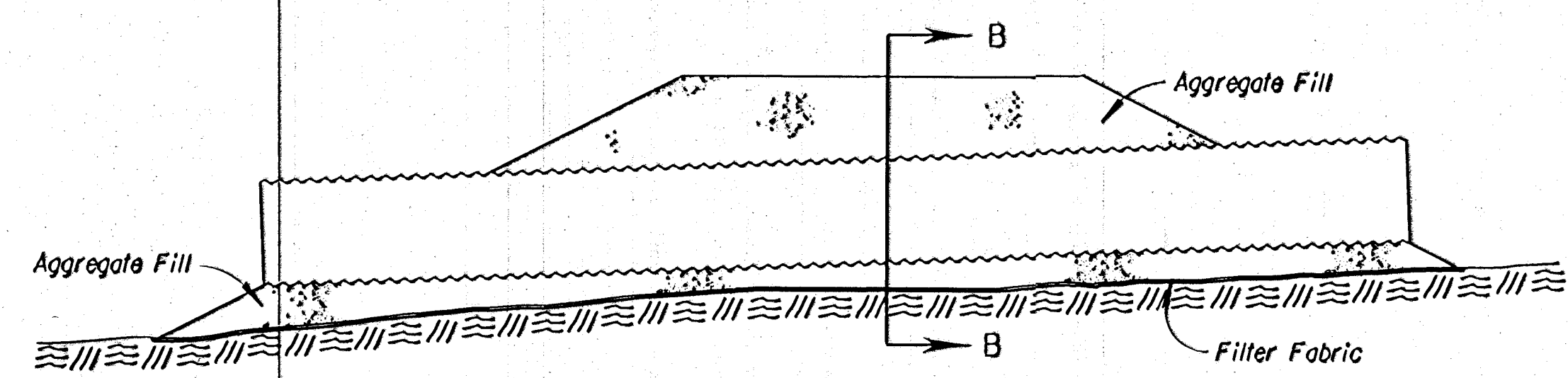

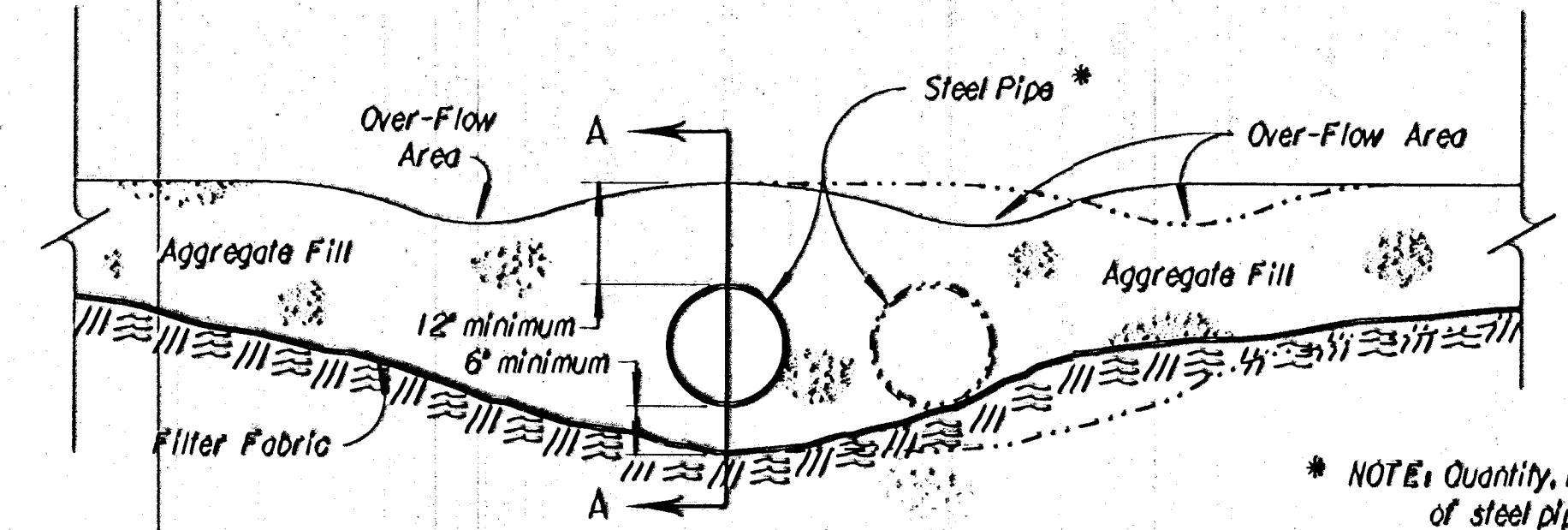
TYPICAL PROFILE OF TEMPORARY BERM
