This Memorandum of Understanding between the United States Air Force, McConnell Air Force Base hereinafter called the Air Force, represented by the installation commander, and the Areawide A-95 Clearinghouse, Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area Planning Commission, Wichita, Kansas, hereinafter called the Clearinghouse, represented by the Secretary of the Wichita-Sedgwick County Metropolitan Area Planning Commission, acting pursuant to Title IV of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act of 1968, Section 204 of the Demonstration Cities and Metropolitan Development Act of 1966, Section 102 of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and Office of Management and Budget Circular A-95 (revised January 2, 1976),

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Air Force and the Clearinghouse are interested in the cooperative evaluation, review and coordination of federal and federally-assisted plans, programs and projects of the Air Force, other federal agencies and local, regional and state agencies.

WHEREAS, the Air Force and the Clearinghouse are interested in consistency and compatibility of all plans, programs and projects.

NOW THEREFORE:

The Air Force agrees to:

1. Submit information on the following plans, programs and projects which may affect local, regional, state or other federal agencies' development plans, programs and projects:

a. Installation Comprehensive Plan Tab A-1 (Environmental Narrative), and socioeconomic analysis for the base.

b. Major military construction.

c. Real Property Acquisitions and Disposals.

d. Withdrawals of Public Domain Land for Military Use.

e. Substantial changes in existing utilization of installations.

f. Draft and Final Environmental Impact Statements, Notices of Intent and Findings of No Significant Impact.

g. Air Installation Compatible Use Zone (AICUZ) studies.

h. Natural Resources Plans, if specifically requested.

i. Military family housing.

2. Incorporate Clearinghouse comments into proposed plans, programs and projects. or, if not accepted, explain in writing within 45 days, the reasons why they were not accepted.

3. Within 30 days of receipt, evaluate, comment and make recommendations with respect to Air Force interests on plans, programs and projects submitted to the Air Force for review.

The Clearinghouse agrees to:

1. Submit to the Air Force for review and comment, project notifications, plans, projects, reports, studies and similar information on land, facility and environmental activities within the vicinity of McConnell Air Force Base (as

defined on the attached map), including but not limited to the following subject areas:

- a. Comprehensive and Land-Use Planning.
 - b. Development Proposals.
 - c. Draft and Final Environmental Impact Statements or Reports as well as Notices of Intent and Findings of No Significant Impact.
 - d. Noise Abatement and Control.
 - e. Wetlands Protection.
 - f. Section 208 Areawide Waste Treatment Management Planning.
 - g. Water Resources Planning.
 - h. Open Space and Recreation Planning.
 - i. Fish and Wildlife Conservation.
 - j. Air Quality.
 - k. Flood Control and Flood Plain Management.
 - l. Transportation and Public Works Planning.
 - m. Energy Facility Planning.
 - n. Historic Preservation.
 - o. Solid Waste Management.
 - p. Environmental Quality Standards Programs and Plans.
2. Incorporate Air Force comments into Clearinghouse responses to applicants or, if not accepted, explain in writing within 45 days, the reasons why they were not incorporated.
 3. Give to the Air Force comments on their submissions within 30 days.
 4. Provide the Air Force a monthly mailing of all information received by the Clearinghouse for A-95 that appears to have a potential impact on the Air Force. Furthermore, the Clearinghouse agrees to provide additional

information, if available, for items identified in this mailing as having a potential impact.

5. Perform the Clearinghouse functions specified in paragraph 3, Part I, Attachment A, Office of Management and Budget Circular A-95.

It is mutually agreed:

1. Environmental Impact Statements will be processed in accordance with NEPA requirements and CEQ guidelines and therefore will not be subject to the time periods indicated above.

2. Failure to provide comments within the periods indicated above implies tacit agreement unless time periods are changed by mutual agreement for a specific requirement.

3. Review process details and appropriate forms may be developed to facilitate uniform and efficient exchange of comments.

4. This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING will be reviewed annually, or more frequently if required, to determine the adequacy of the review process and types of projects to be deleted from automatic review.

5. Nothing herein shall be construed as obligating the Air Force or the Clearinghouse to violate existing laws or regulations.

6. This agreement shall remain in effect until terminated or revised in writing.

We have entered into an agreement with McConnell to undertake certain activities in relation to Planning insofar as it relates to the Base. The area of activity would include any proceeding or activity, or plan that might fall within the noise impact areas of McConnell as reflected on the future land use map, Figure 4-5, in the AICUZ report.

As a minimum, I would think that any report that we prepared, including such general items as population, land use, or any public facility plan, even though not directly pointed to that area, such as a countywide wastewater plan, should be directed to Larry Janssen, Environmental and Contract Planning Section, 381st Civil Engineering Squadron, McConnell Air Force Base, 67221. This would include any drafts that would normally go out to the Planning Commission or any drafts that would go out for general staff review and comment.

I would also like to have our zoning maps or atlases marked so that any proceeding, zoning, subdivision, BZA, annexation, etc., falling within the same lines, be identified and that Janssen be notified of the proceeding, together with the staff report, i.e., pink sheets and/or zoning staff reports in our normal mailout. This would also include such things as flood plain maps, historic preservation cases. Any CIP activities within the area, I would think would also require their attention.

As to A-95's, I would think that we would proceed with the letter-type of information we send to the Planning Commission and send that to Janssen. If he needs more information, then he can give us a call.

Please let me know if you have additional suggestions as to coordination procedures, or if you have problems with the suggestions contained above.

Dear Colonel Brooks:

I think that your suggested memorandum of understanding is certainly a step in the right direction. There are a couple of items which I would like an opportunity to further review. It would appear that the MOU, perhaps is overly ambitious in terms of some of the items included as an obligation on our part. There are certain activities, as an example, that we do not have any responsibility for, including Wetlands Protection, Fish and Wildlife Conservation and Energy Facility Planning. These are being conducted by their offices. Certainly I have no problem with furnishing you A-95 Review requests, even though they may fall into these areas. I also have no problem in incorporating any of your Air Force comments in the Clearinghouse responses to the applicants. Sometimes we don't get a satisfactory response from the applicants, but at least we are putting that into the hands of the appropriate Federal agency for evaluation.

I would also like for you to reconsider the clause requiring a monthly report listing all information received by our Clearinghouse as A-95 processing requests. We currently do not generate these types of reports and this will require additional manpower and activity on our part. I would hope that we would be able to agree to rely on the assessment of our staff personnel as to when the A-95's had a potential impact on the Air Force. In order to further train our staff, I would be more than pleased to have any members of your staff sit down and review the listing of projects that we reviewed over the last year to see that we have a clear understanding of what you perceive to be impactful on the Base.

 - g. Air Installation Compatible Use Zone (AICUZ) studies.
 - h. Natural Resources Plans, if specifically requested.
 - i. Military family housing.
2. Incorporate Clearinghouse comments into proposed plans, programs and projects, or, if not accepted, explain in writing within 45 days, the reasons why they were not accepted.
3. Within 30 days of receipt, evaluate, comment and make recommendations with respect to Air Force interests on plans, programs and projects submitted to the Air Force for review.

The Clearinghouse agrees to:

1. Submit to the Air Force for review and comment, project notifications, plans, projects, reports, studies and similar information on land, facility and environmental activities within the vicinity of McConnell Air Force Base (as defined on the attached map), including but not limited to the following subject areas:

- a. Comprehensive and Land-Use Planning.
- b. Development Proposals.
- c. Draft and Final Environmental Impact Statements or Reports.
- d. Noise Abatement and Control.
- e. Wetlands Protection.
- f. Section 208 Areawide Waste Treatment Management Planning.
- g. Water Resources Planning.
- h. Open Space and Recreation Planning.
- i. Fish and Wildlife Conservation.
- j. Air Quality.

- n. Historic Preservation.
- o. Solid Waste Management.

2. Incorporate Air Force comments into Clearinghouse responses to applicants or, if not accepted, explain in writing within 45 days, the reasons why they were not incorporated.

3. Give to the Air Force comments on their submissions within 30 days.

4. Provide the Air Force monthly, a listing of all information received by the Clearinghouse for A-95 coordination and additional information upon request.

5. Perform the Clearinghouse functions specified in paragraph 3, Part I, Attachment A, Office of Management and Budget Circular A-95.

It is mutually agreed:

1. Environmental Impact Statements will be processed in accordance with NEPA requirements and CEQ guidelines and therefore will not be subject to the time periods indicated above.

2. Review process details and appropriate forms may be developed to facilitate uniform and efficient exchange of comments.

3. This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING will be reviewed annually, or more frequently if required, to determine the adequacy of the review process and types of projects to be deleted from automatic review.

4. Nothing herein shall be construed as obligating the Air Force or the Clearinghouse to violate existing laws or regulations.

5. This agreement shall remain in effect until terminated or revised in writing.

The prime benefit to be attained through the development and use of a well-drafted memorandum of understanding is an increased level of awareness on issues of mutual concern. Better cooperation on situations affecting the types of planning, protection, and conservation which are cited in the memorandum would be possible.

In response to concerns voiced in paragraph 2 of your letter, dated 20 Feb 80, if we do not receive a monthly report on actions affecting our installation, we cannot fulfill our statutory duty as set forth in OMB Circular A-95 and the Inter-governmental Cooperation Act of 1968 to respond to issues and developments concerning the Air Force and the City of Wichita within a 30-day suspense.

In response to paragraph 3 of the above referenced letter, we define "the vicinity of McConnell AFB" as including any area falling within the legal description of the base and the associated base housing. In relation to noise issues, which are probably of greatest concern, consult your copy of the latest AICUZ Plan. Any area within the 65 L.D.N. contour is of direct concern to us.

Upon advice of our Environmental Planning and Legal Offices, we feel a short meeting to discuss and resolve specific objections to this proposal would be the most effective way to reach agreement on the proposed Memorandum of Understanding.

We will assemble the necessary staff at your convenience.
