BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY

SECTION 1. That having received a recommendation from the Planning Commission, and proper notice having been given and hearing held as provided by law and under authority and subject to the provisions of The Wichita-Sedgwick County Unified Zoning Code, Section V-C, as adopted by Section 28.04.010, as amended, the zoning classification or districts of the lands legally described hereby are changed as follows:

Zone change request in the City from SF-5 Single-Family Residential District, GC General Commercial District and LC Limited Commercial District to LI Limited Industrial District zoning, on property legally described as:

That part of the Northwest Quarter of Section 16, Township 28 South, Range 1 East of the 6th P.M., Sedgwick County, Kansas as prepared by Baughman Company, P.A., CLS 58, surveyors in aforementioned county and state on November 28, 2023, more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the Southwest corner of said Northwest Quarter; THENCE North coincident with the west boundary line of said Northwest Quarter, a distance of 1251.62 feet, for a Point of Beginning; THENCE continuing North, a distance of 82.50 feet; THENCE East, parallel with the South boundary line of said Northwest Quarter, a distance of 350.00 feet; THENCE North, parallel with the West boundary line of said Northwest Quarter, a distance of 98.59 feet; THENCE East, parallel with the South boundary line of said Northwest Quarter, a distance of 973.00 feet; THENCE South, a distance of 181.09 feet; THENCE West, parallel with the South boundary line of said Northwest Quarter, a distance of 1323.00 feet to the point of beginning, except the West 30 feet for street; TOGETHER WITH Lots 1 and 2, Haney Addition to Wichita, Sedgwick County, Kansas.

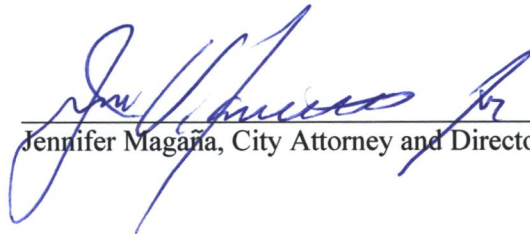

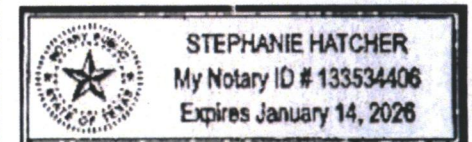

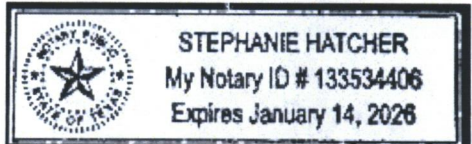

REQUEST: LI Limited Industrial District and a Conditional Use

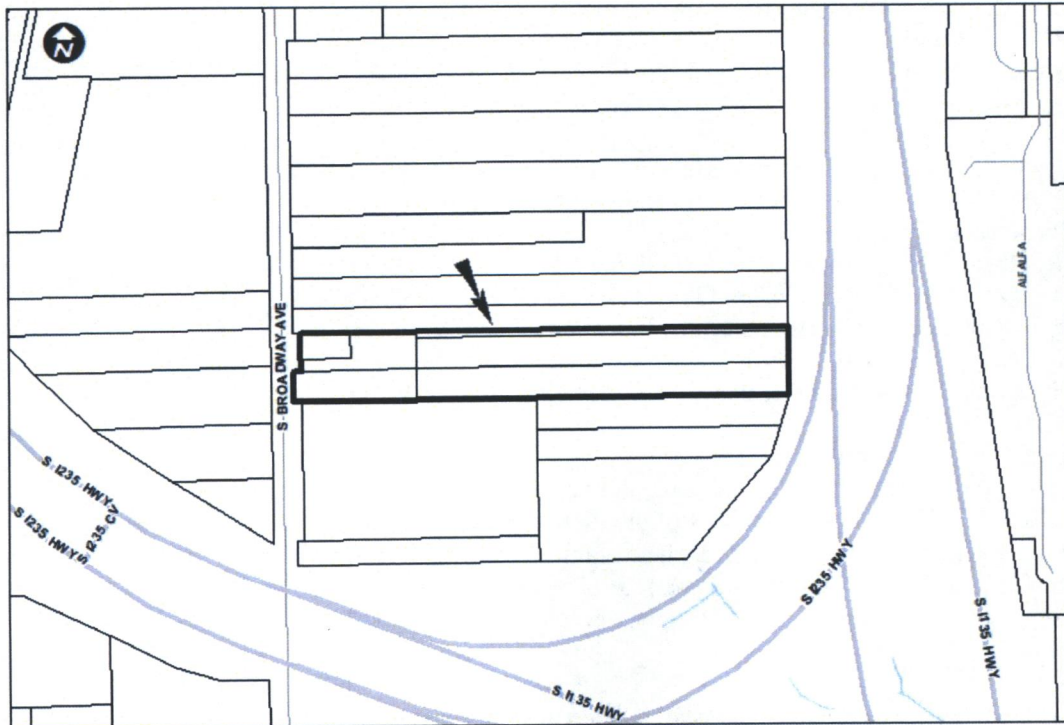
CURRENT ZONING: SF-5 Single-Family Residential District, LC Limited Commercial District, GC General Commercial District

SITE SIZE: 4.92 acres

LOCATION: Generally located on the east side of South Broadway and within one-eighth of a mile north of Interstate 235 (4204 South Broadway Avenue).

PROPOSED USE: Wrecking/Salvage Yard

RECOMMENDATION: Approve with conditions



BACKGROUND: The applicant is requesting two things:

1. a zone change from SF-5 Single-Family Residential District, LC Limited Commercial District, and GC General Commercial District to LI Limited Industrial District
2. a Conditional Use request in order to permit a Wrecking/Salvage Yard on the entire property/subject site.

The site is approximately 4.92 acres, generally located on the east side of South Broadway and one-eighth of a mile north of Interstate 235. The requests would permit the applicant to utilize the site as a Wrecking/Salvage Yard for the entirety of the property. The applicant is also requesting a waiver of Supplementary Use Regulation Section III-D.6.e(1) of the Unified Zoning Code (UZC). This waiver would allow the Conditional Use despite abutting both an arterial street and a freeway as discussed below.

Wrecking/Salvage Yards are subject to Supplementary Use Regulation Section III-D.6.e of the UZC. Section III-D.6.e states that Wrecking/Salvage Yards may be approved as a Conditional Use in the LI Limited Industrial District, provided that such operation:

1. Is not Abutting an arterial Street, expressway or freeway;
2. In the opinion of the Planning Commission, will not adversely affect the character of the neighborhood; and,
3. Is enclosed by a Fence or wall not less than eight feet in height and having cracks and openings not in excess of five percent of the area of such Fence.

Wrecking/Salvage Yards are also subject to Supplementary Use Regulation Section III-D.6.dd of the UZC. Section III-D.6.dd states that, "In LC Limited Commercial District through LI Limited Industrial District, the Outdoor Storage and or baling of junk, scrap, paper, bottles, rags, or similar materials is prohibited." This regulation has also been added to the list of recommended conditions of approval.

The character of the neighborhood is generally industrial with some manufactured home residential. Property to the north is zoned LC Limited Commercial District and SF-5 Single-Family Residential District and is developed with an office/warehouse combination. Property to the east, across from the junction of Interstate 235 and Interstate 135 is zoned MH Manufactured Housing District and is developed with a Manufactured Home Park. This MH District is approximately 480 feet to the east because of the wide right-of-way where Interstate 235 and Interstate 135 meet. Property to the south is zoned GC General Commercial District and SF-5 Single-Family District and is developed with a used car lot. Property to the west, across South Broadway Avenue, is zoned GC General Commercial District and LI Limited Industrial District and is developed with a Manufactured Home Park.

Compatibility setback and height standards would apply to the eastern portion of the site since it abuts the SF-5 Single-Family Residential District zoning on both the north and south property lines. In accordance with Section IV-C.4 of the UZC, the compatibility building interior side and rear setbacks shall be 25 feet. In addition, the compatibility height standards in accordance with Section IV.C.5 of the UZC shall be in effect. This section states that a building cannot exceed 35 feet in height within 50 feet of the lot line of a property zoned TF-3 or more restrictive. For every three feet greater than 50 feet from the lot line, the building can gain one-foot in height.

With residential property abutting the subject property on the north, south and west sides, the site would be required to come into compliance with screening, lighting, and landscaping standards set forth in the UZC and the Wichita Landscape Ordinance. Section IV-B of the UZC addresses screening and lighting standards, requiring a minimum of a six-foot solid screening fence where abutting residential zoning. The site would also be required to comply with screening of mechanical equipment as described in Section IV-B.3.e. In addition to screening, the applicant shall install a landscape buffer along the north, east, and west property lines where abutting residential zoning districts.

The subject site would not be required to install a landscaped street yard or screen the existing parking lots. The City of Wichita Landscape Ordinance allows exceptions to these requirements when there is no renovation to a nonresidential building or not renovating or expanding an existing parking lot.

ZON2023-00071 and CON2023-65

Metropolitan Area Planning Commission

CASE HISTORY: On April 18, 1984 a portion of the subject site was platted as Lots 1 and 2 of the Haney Addition. The other lots within the subject site are unplatted and will be required to be platted before any building permits are issued. There are no other zoning cases associated with the subject sites.

PUBLIC SERVICES: South Broadway Avenue is a four-lane arterial street without sidewalks. Municipal water, sanitary sewer and stormwater currently serve the site. Wichita Transit does not serve the site.

CONFORMANCE TO PLANS/POLICIES: The proposed zone change is in partial conformance with the *Community Investments Plan* and is not in conformance with the *South Wichita/Haysville Area Plan*:

Community Investments Plan: The 2035 Wichita Future Growth Concept Map, which outlines the preferred development pattern and land uses within the *Plan* area, identifies this subject site as appropriate for “New Employment,” “Commercial,” and “Residential” development and use. “New Employment” areas “likely will be developed or redeveloped by 2035 with uses that constitute centers or concentrations of employment primarily in manufacturing, warehousing, distribution, construction, research, technology, business services, or corporate offices. Major shopping centers and office parks likely will be developed within this area as well, based upon market driven location factors. In certain areas, especially those in proximity to existing residential uses, higher density housing and convenience retail centers likely will be developed. In areas where the uses are already established, pockets of industrial uses associated with extraction, processing or refinement of natural resources or recycling of waste materials likely will be developed.” “Residential” areas should, “reflect the full diversity of residential development densities and types typically found in a large urban municipality. The range of housing densities and types includes, but is not limited to, single-family detached homes, semi-detached homes, zero lot line units, patio homes, duplexes, townhouses, apartments and multi-family units, condominiums, mobile home parks, and special residential accommodations for the elderly (assisted living, congregate care and nursing homes).” “Commercial” areas “reflect the full diversity of commercial development intensities and types typically found in a large urban municipality. Convenience retail, restaurants, small offices, and personal service uses are located in close proximity to, and potentially mixed with, Residential Uses.” The subject site are located in an industrial, under-utilized area of the City. The recommended conditions for the proposed Wrecking/Salvage yard, should mitigate substantial detrimental impacts to the surrounding area.

The request is in conformance with the Land Use Compatibility Locational Guidelines of the Comprehensive Plan. These guidelines recommend that “Industrial and major commercial land uses that generate pollution, odor, noise, light, safety hazards, and high levels of traffic should be located away from residential areas and developed with screening, buffering, and site design features sufficient to mitigate adverse impacts.” The applicant will be required to mitigate possible adverse impacts by screening and buffering the use with fences or walls and landscaping. It should be noted that residential uses are adjacent to the subject site, with a Manufactured Home Park to the west, and another a few lots to the north. Additionally, the applicant is requesting a condition that if any inoperable vehicle is on-site, it will be temporary and that any salvaging would be prohibited.

South Wichita/Haysville Area Plan: The requested rezoning is not in compliance with the South Wichita/Haysville Area Plan. The site is located within the boundaries of the *South Wichita/ Haysville Area Plan (SW/HAP)*. Chapter Four of the plan discusses the desire for new commercial development in the area. The SW/HAP future development concept map also identifies the subject site as appropriate for commercial retail development. The use of Wrecking/Salvage Yard is considered an industrial use.

RECOMMENDATION: Based upon the information available at the time the staff report was completed, staff recommends **APPROVAL** of the requests, subject to the following conditions:

1. Outdoor Storage and Vehicle Storage Yard shall be restricted from the east 100 feet of the subject parcels and shall be restricted to the "Gravel Vehicle Storage Area" as indicated by the site plan.
2. Per Section IV-A.2.b of the UZC, all Parking areas, Loading areas, and driveways on all Developments other than low-density residential Developments shall be surfaced with concrete, asphaltic concrete, asphalt or other comparable surfacing and shall be maintained in good condition and free of weeds, dust, trash and other debris. Areas designated for Vehicle Storage shall be designed with an All-Weather Surface
3. Outdoor Storage shall adhere to Section III-D.6.dd of the Unified Zoning Code specifically prohibiting the storage and/or baling of junk, scrap, paper, bottles, rags, or similar materials.
4. Vehicle Storage Yard shall be the main use of the subject property. However, if an inoperable vehicle is on-site, it will be temporary, and any salvage would be prohibited.
5. Expansion into Phase II (as indicated on the Site Plan) may occur concurrently or in multiple phases. This expansion shall follow the requirements set forth in the Conditional Use for site requirements (screening, fencing, etc.).
6. Amendments, adjustments, or interpretations to this Conditional Use shall be done in accordance with the Unified Zoning Code.
7. The transfer of title of all or any portion of land included within the Conditional Use (or any amendments thereto) does not constitute a termination of the Conditional Use or any portion thereof, but said Conditional Use shall run with the land and be binding upon present owners, their successors and assigns.
8. Development of the site shall be in general conformance with the approved site plan.
9. If the Zoning Administrator finds that there is a violation of any of the conditions of the Conditional Use, the Zoning Administrator, in addition to enforcing of other remedies set forth in the UZC, with the concurrence of the Planning Director, declare that the Conditional Use is null and void.

This recommendation is based on the following findings:

1. The zoning, uses and character of the neighborhood: The character of the neighborhood is generally industrial with some manufactured home residential. Property to the north is zoned LC Limited Commercial District and SF-5 Single-Family Residential District and is developed with an office/warehouse combination. Property to the east, across from the junction of Interstate 235 and Interstate 135 is zoned MH Manufactured Housing District and is developed with a Manufactured Home Park. This MH District is approximately 480 feet to the east because of the wide right-of-way where Interstate 235 and Interstate 135 meet. Property to the south is zoned GC General Commercial District and SF-5 Single-Family District and is developed with a used car lot. Property to the west, across South Broadway Avenue, is zoned GC General Commercial District and LI Limited Industrial District and is developed with a Manufactured Home Park.
2. The suitability of the subject property for the uses to which it has been restricted: The properties are zoned LC Limited Commercial District, GC General Commercial District, and SF-5 Single-Family Residential District, which would allow for a large range of commercial uses on the west ends of the properties and several residential and civic and public uses on the east ends.
3. Extent to which removal of the restrictions will detrimentally affect nearby property: Approval of the request would allow all uses permitted in the LI Limited Industrial District on the site. The applicant intends to utilize the entire property, excluding the eastern 100 feet, as a Vehicle Storage Yard with Wrecking/Salvage Yard as a secondary use. Considering the properties to the south and north include SF-5 Single-Family Residential Districts, the removal of restrictions could negatively affect nearby property. However, the existing nature of the surrounding property is industrial in nature. Also, the

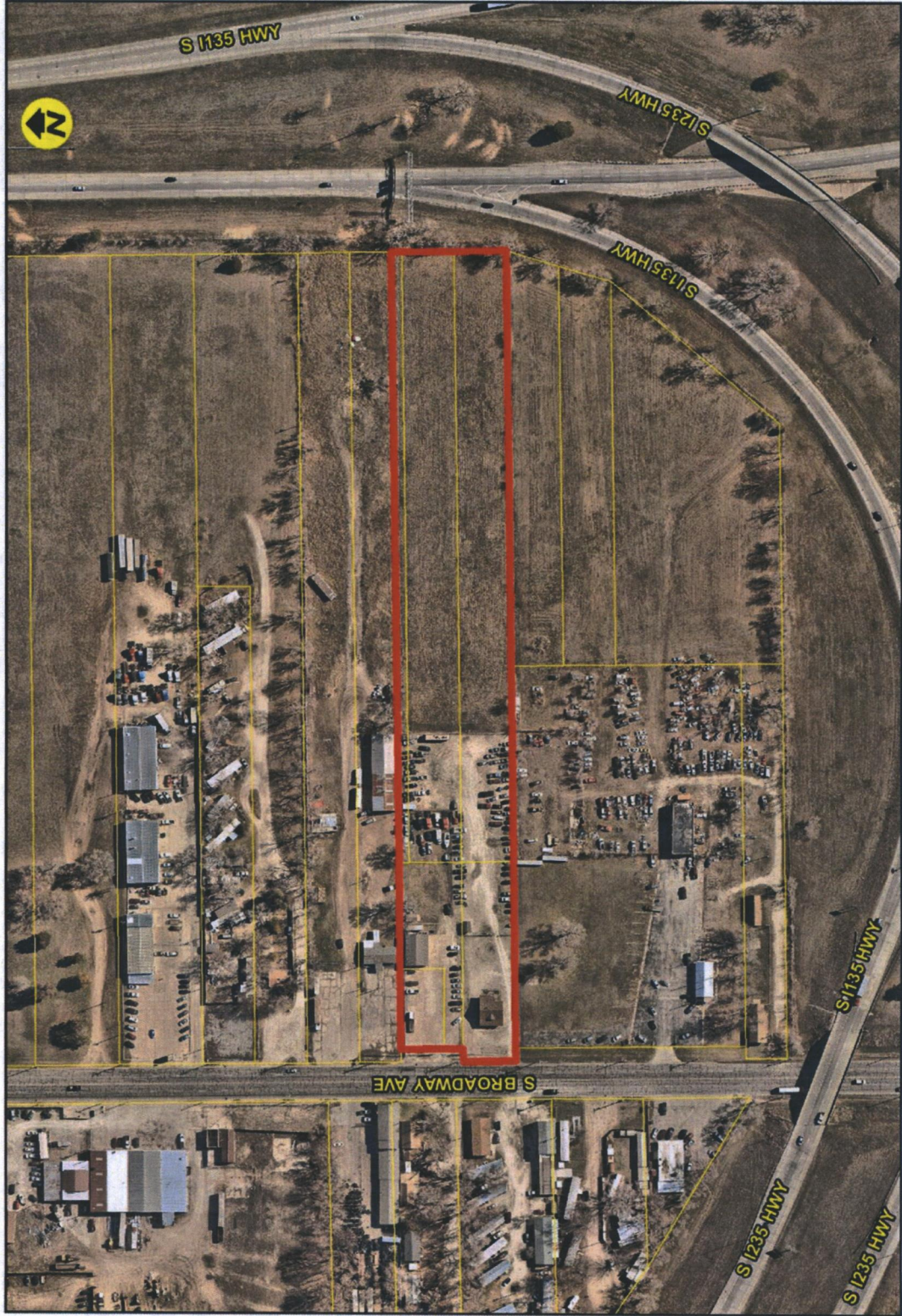
proposed conditions are designed to mitigate any possible negative impacts to nearby property.

4. Length of time subject property has remained vacant as zoned: The northern parcel is currently being used by the applicant for their offices. The southern parcel has been vacant for an undetermined amount of time.
5. Relative gain to the public health, safety and welfare as compared to the loss in value or the hardship imposed upon the applicant: It is not expected that the requested Conditional Use would have any significant negative affects to surrounding properties. Denial of the request could represent a loss in the use and enjoyment of the applicant's property.
6. Conformance of the requested change to the adopted or recognized Comprehensive Plan and policies: The requested zone change is in partial conformance with the *Community Investments Plan* and is not in conformance with the *South Wichita/Haysville Area Plan* as discussed in the staff report.
7. Impact of the proposed development on community facilities: The Planning Department does not anticipate the requested zone change will have a significant impact on community facilities. Existing public infrastructure at the site should accommodate uses under the proposed LI zoning.
8. Opposition or support of neighborhood residents: At the time of publication of the staff report, staff has not received any public comments regarding this case.

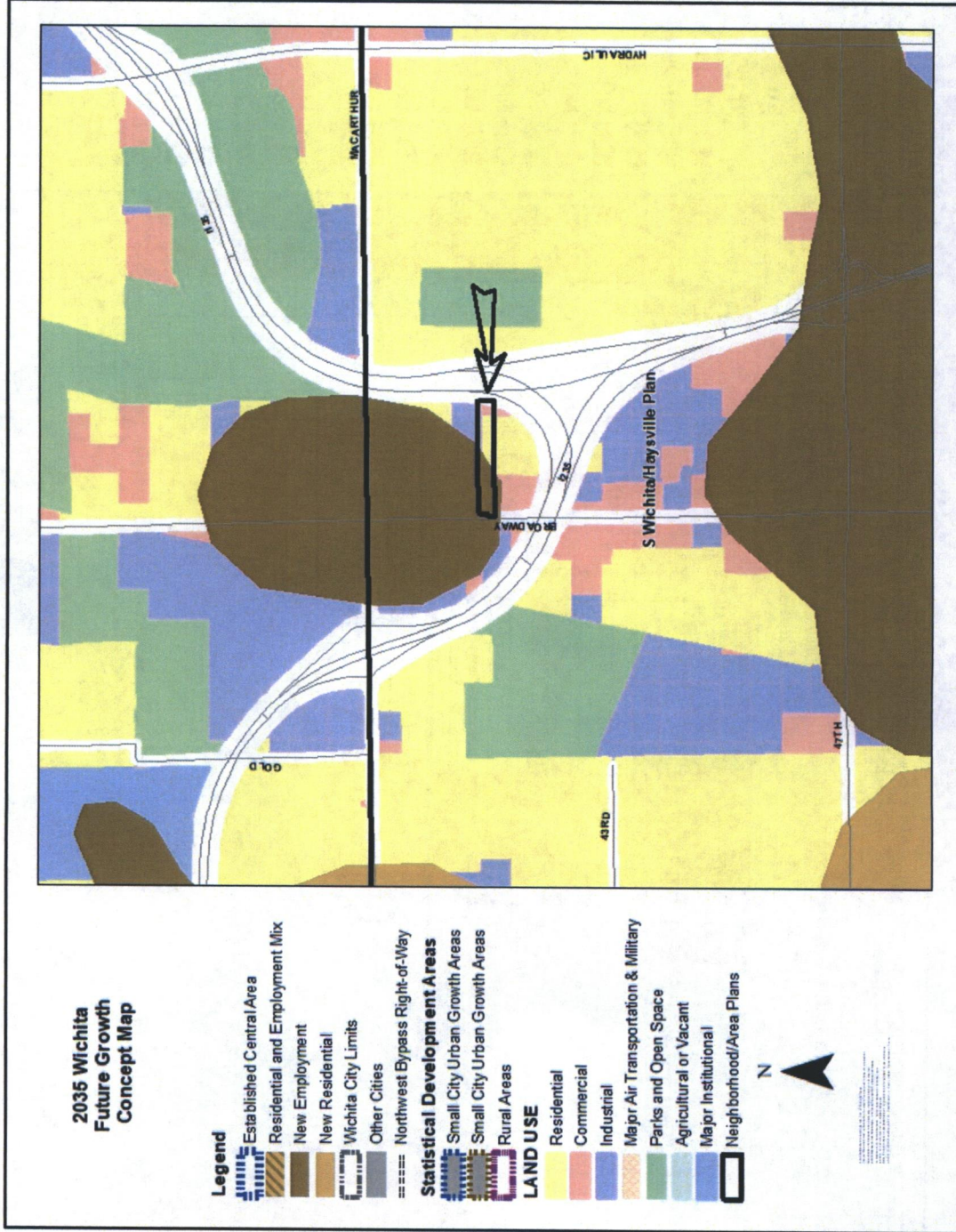

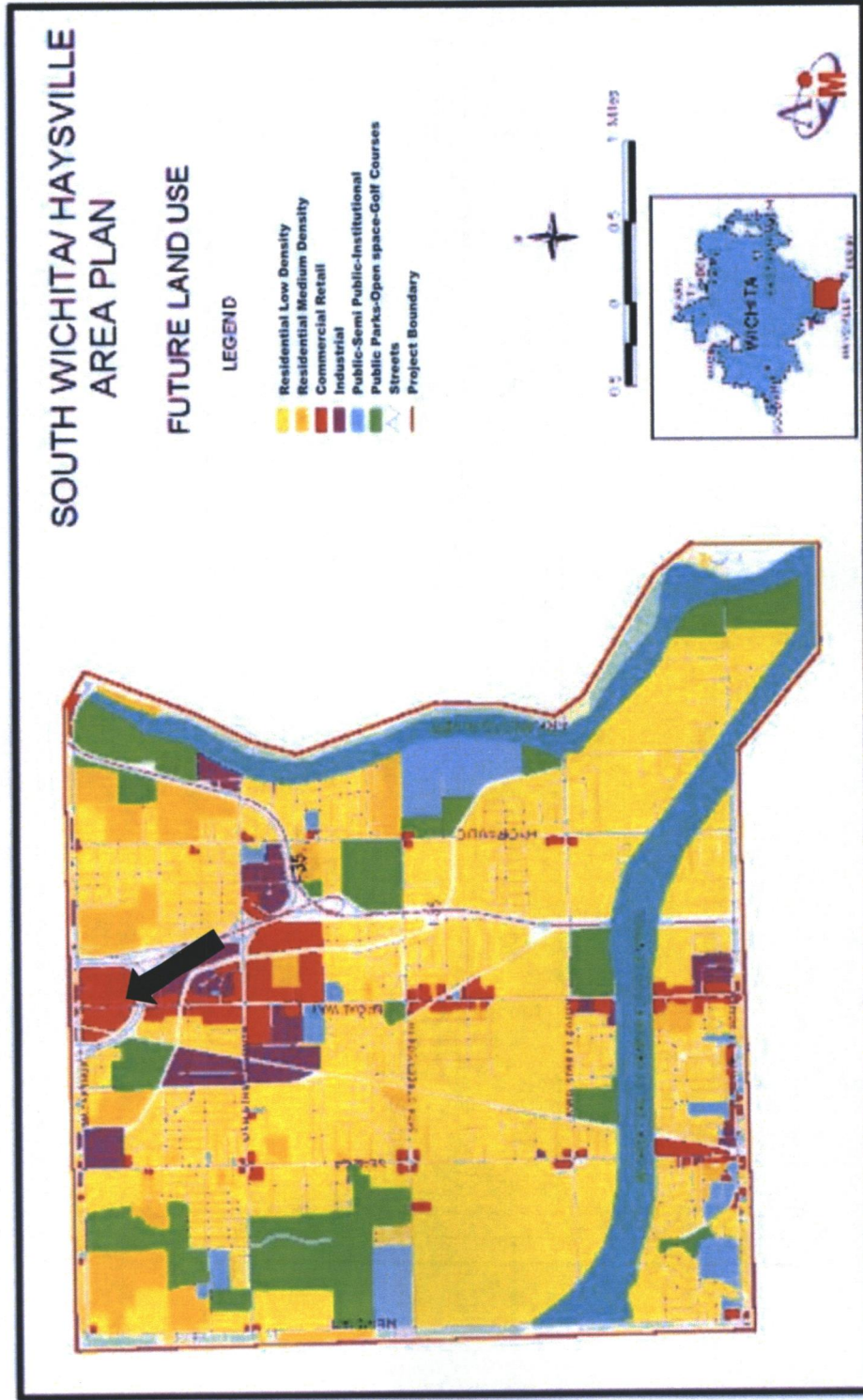
Attachment 1. Aerial Map



Attachment 3. Land Use Map

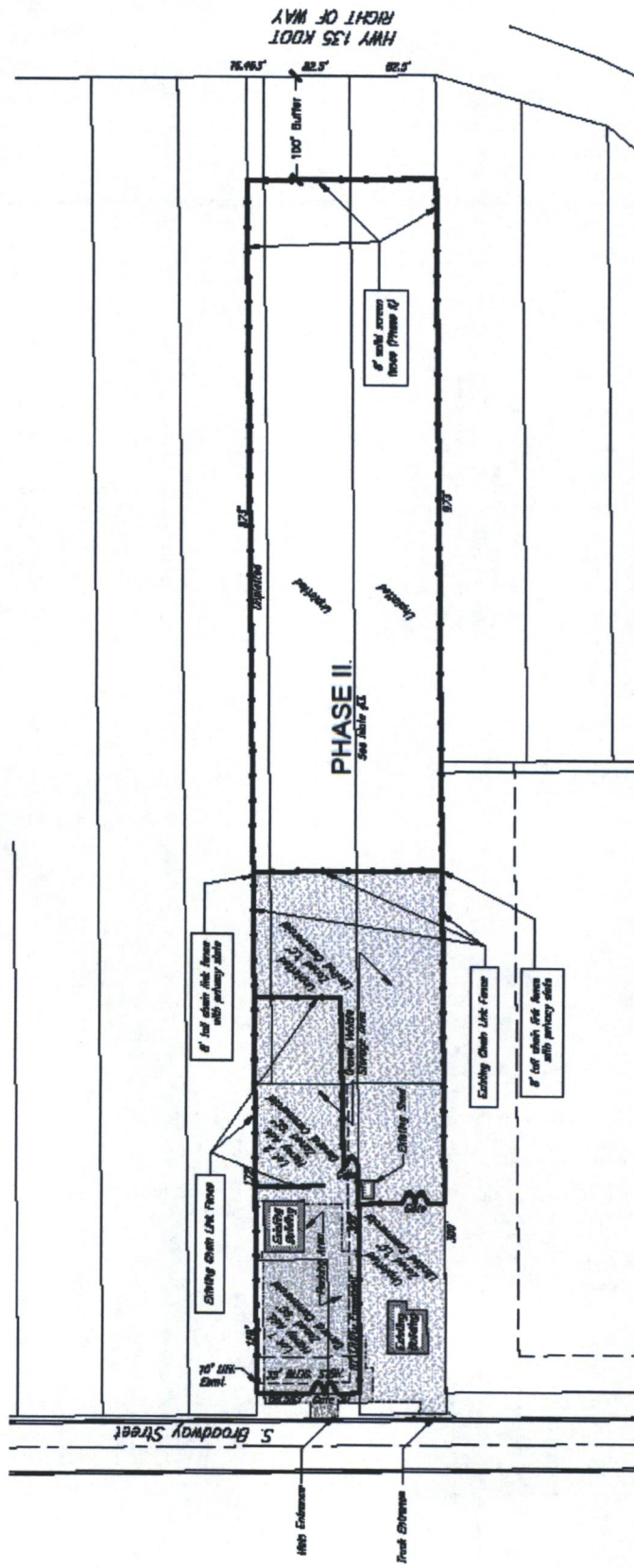


Attachment 4. South Wichita/Haysville Area Plan Land Use Map

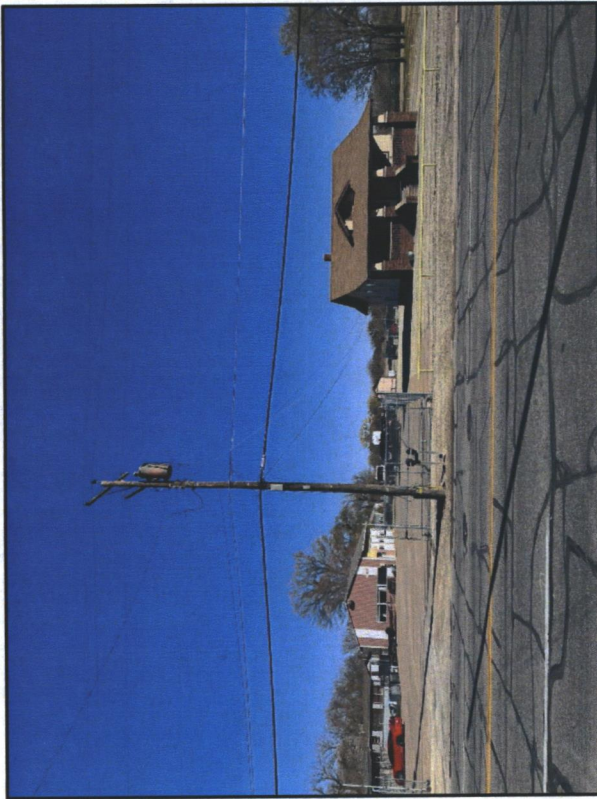


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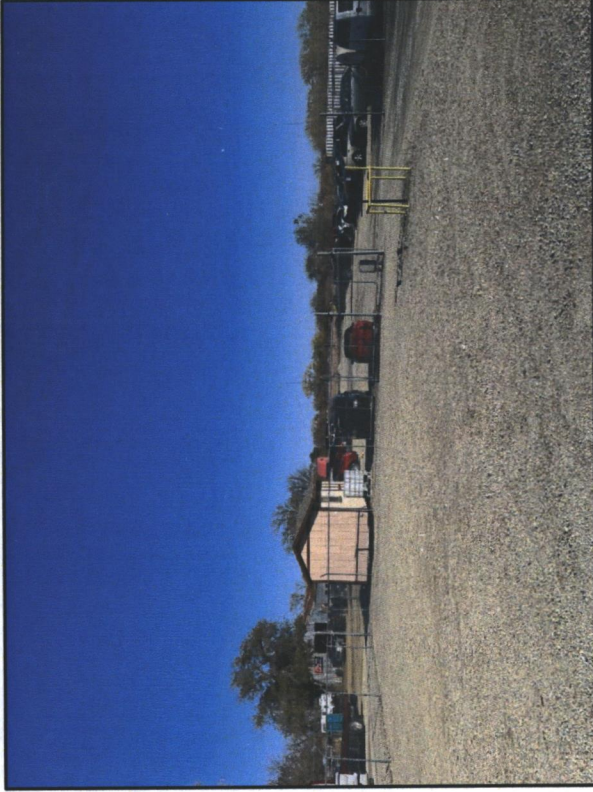
- The subject property shall be limited to all uses permitted by-right in the "U" Limited Industrial zoning district. In addition, the following Conditional Use shall be allowed with provisions as set forth for wrecking/salvage yard.
 - Outdoor Storage and Vehicle Storage Yard shall be restricted from the east 100 feet of the subject parcels.
 - Outdoor Storage and Vehicle Storage shall adhere to Section II-D.6.dd of the Unified Zoning Code specifically prohibiting the storage and/or piling of junk, scrap, paper, bottles, rags, or similar materials.
 - Vehicle Storage Yard shall be the main use of the subject property. However, if an inoperable vehicle is on-site, it will be temporary, and any salvage would be prohibited.
- Expansion into Phase II may occur concurrently or in multiple phases. This expansion shall follow the requirements set forth in the Conditional Use for site requirements (screening, fencing, etc.)
- Amendments, adjustments, or interpretations to this Conditional Use shall be done in accordance with the Unified Zoning Code.
- The Transfer of title of all or any portion of land included within the Conditional Use (CU) (or any amendments thereto) does not constitute a termination of the CU or any portion thereof, but said CU shall run with the land and be binding upon present owners, their successors and assigns.

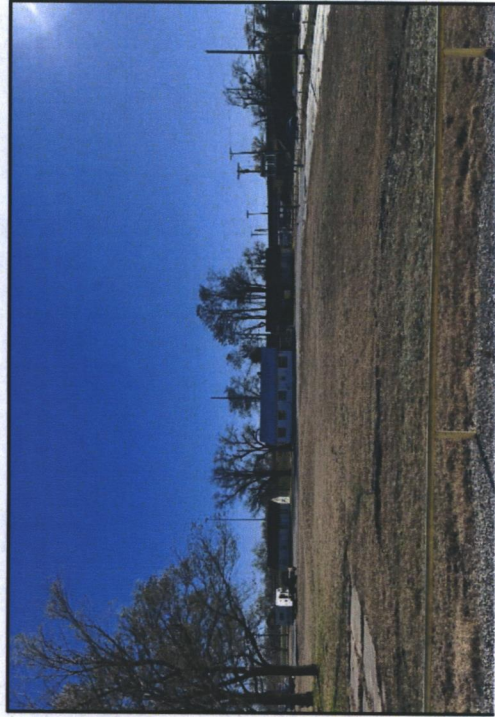

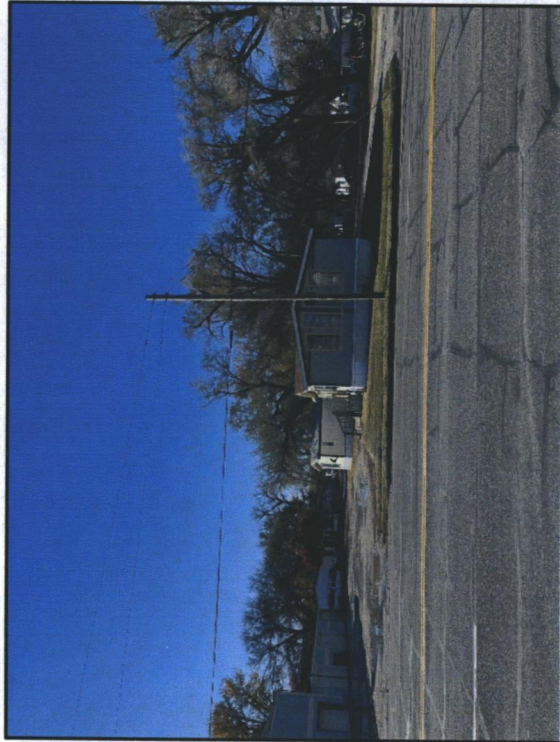
