Staff Recommendation: Approve vacation.

MAPC Recommendation: Approve vacation (unanimous).

Background: This is the vacation of a portion of a platted 20-foot [centerline] utility easement, with 10 feet of easement is located along the side of applicant's property. The purpose of the vacation was to increase the buildable area, for a larger house. Staff and MAPC have recommended approval because no utilities, public or private, will be compromised at this site, adequate easement area will remain, and the vacation will not adversely affect the public interest.

This vacation has been reviewed and approved by the Planning Commission, subject to conditions and recording within 30 days.

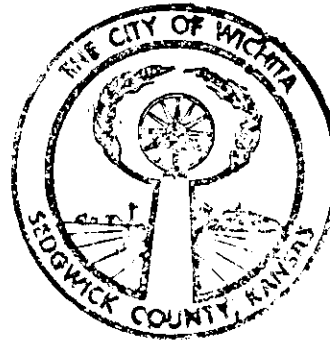

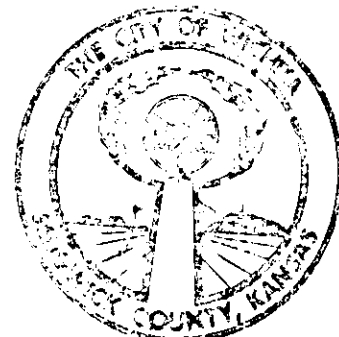

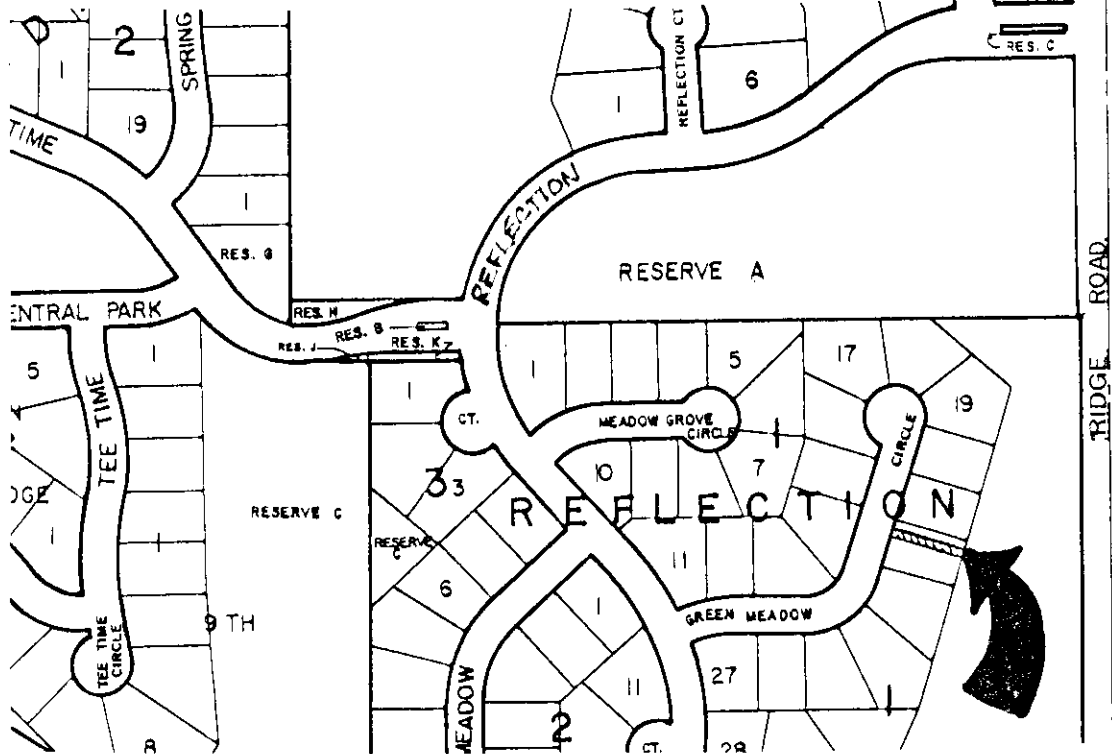
